Child Care Services

- NEA offers child care services at the Annual Meeting from June 28 to July 5.
 - **Camp NEA** welcomes children ages 6 months – 9 years. Children participate in age-appropriate activities including arts and crafts projects, active games and much more in a safe, nurturing environment.
 - **Club NEA** welcomes youth ages 10 years – 16 years, where they will have their own place to “hang out” with video games, pool table, arts and crafts, and other fun equipment as well as movies and crafts.
- **REGISTRATION.** To ensure proper staffing and to be able to accommodate as many campers as possible, there will be a \$10 fee assessed for each day that a registered camper does not show up for camp. If your child is not in Camp/Club NEA by 10:00am on the date you have registered your child (ren), your space will be given up to any onsite children on the waiting list. As always communication is key, please let us know onsite if your camper will be late or absent to camp so we can better accommodate you and other children. We will assume your child will attend during the hours registered. On-site registrants will be accommodated as space and staff is available. - **MEALS.** Parents may pre-order children’s lunches and dinners on this form. **NO LUNCHES WILL BE ORDERED ON-SITE.** If your child is not present for the designated lunch or dinner times ACCENT will be unable to guarantee availability for your child’s meal.
- **DRESS CODE.** To clarify expectations for behavior at Camp NEA, all Parents and Campers will be expected to sign the Camp NEA Code of Conduct on their first day of camp this year.
