



Signature Collection Do's and Don'ts

Yes! Do the following:

- ✓ Do invite **EVERYONE** to collect signatures, adults, kids, voter, non-voter, citizens, non-citizens.
- ✓ Do only have one city or town per each signature sheet.
- ✓ Do keep each signature form perfectly clean.
- ✓ Do be assertive.
- ✓ Do look official. Have a sticker from the campaign, permission letter, and rules on gathering.
- ✓ Do work the area and speak to everyone.
- ✓ Do keep your materials organized.
- ✓ Specify to signers that they need to use their current voting address. Only addresses where they are currently registered to vote will count.
- ✓ Make sure they have a legible signature or print their name on the same line.
- ✓ Only their street address (no city, Zip code or ward/precinct).
- ✓ Make sure the city/town is printed on the bottom-front, top-back, and bottom-back.

Oh, no! Be careful:

- ✗ ONLY collect signatures from registered voters.
- ✗ Signatures will be disqualified if they are not from town designated on the sheet.
- ✗ Squiggles, **highlighting**, underlines, names, initials, or phone numbers will get **DISQUALIFIED**.
- ✗ Don't print signature papers yourself. Wrong paper size, color, one-sided paper will be disqualified.
- ✗ Don't just sit at the table—get moving and talk to voters!
- ✗ Do not correct mistakes on the same line. Start a new line!
- ✗ Do not write for other people, and do NOT forge a signature or copy names off a list.
