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WELCOME TO THE MTA 2019 SUMMER CONFERENCE

ABOUT THE UNIVERSITY OF MASSACHUSETTS AMHERST (UMASS AMHERST)

The MTA's 2019 Summer Conference will be held Sunday, August 4, through Wednesday, August 7, 2019, at UMass Amherst in Amherst, MA. UMass Amherst makes a profound, transformative impact on the common good, and is the flagship public higher education campus in the Commonwealth of Massachusetts.

Founded in 1863, UMass Amherst is the largest public research university in New England, distinguished by the excellence and breadth of its academic, research and community outreach programs.

DIRECTIONS TO UMASS AMHERST

MTA Registration at UMass Amherst is in North Residence Hall C, just off of Eastman Lane, between North Thatcher Street and North Pleasant Street. If using Google Maps, enter 54 Eastman Lane, Amherst MA, as a destination point.

If you are a first-time visitor and traveling from the east or west on I-90 (Mass Pike), it is recommended that you avoid Exit 8 off the Mass Pike and instead follow the directions to Exit 4 listed below.

- From the North. From I-91 South, take exit 25 in Deerfield. At the end of the ramp, turn left and follow road to the intersection. Turn right onto Routes 5 & 10 South. Go 1 mile, then turn left onto Route 116 South. Follow 8 miles to the UMass exit.
- From the East. Via Route 2 West to Exit 16 (Belchertown/Amherst). From Route 2 take Route 202 South for about 15 miles to a blinking yellow light at Amherst Road. (You will see signs "to Rt 9 and Rt 116"). Turn right and follow Amherst Road (becomes Pelham Road after about 4 miles) for 7 miles to Amherst center. Follow signs to UMass.
- From the South. From I-91 North, take Exit 19 in Northampton. From the exit ramp, turn right onto Route 9. Travel approximately 4.5 miles to Route 116 North (turn left at traffic lights). The UMass exit is 1 mile up.
- From the West. From Route 2 East, follow to Greenfield/I-91 exit. Take I-91 South to Exit 25, Deerfield. At the end of the ramp turn left and follow the road to the intersection. Turn right onto Routes 5 & 10 South. Go 1 mile, then turn left onto Route 116 South. Follow for 8 miles to the UMass exit.
- From I-90 (Mass Pike). Take Exit 4 (West Springfield). Follow I-91 North to Exit 19. From the exit ramp, turn right onto Route 9. Travel approximately 4.5 miles to Route 116 North (turn left at traffic lights). The UMass exit is 1 mile up.

REGISTRATION & CHECK-IN / CHECK-OUT

REGISTRATION & CHECK-IN

We ask that all participants check in at Registration in North Residence Hall C when you first arrive, whether or not you are staying in the dorms. This includes all attendees, staff, presenters, vendors and commuters. Upon registration, you will receive your badge, meal card and conference materials. **You will need to wear your badge at all times during the conference.** If you are staying on campus, you will also receive your dorm room keys and be directed to your dorm. Please see the chart below for registration hours. Outside of these hours, dorm keys can be picked up in North Residence Hall C. Those who have a payment due, would like to register onsite, or adjust housing/meals will need to arrive between 8 a.m. and 9 a.m. or 12 p.m. and 1 p.m. Monday through Wednesday. Upon arrival, you should park your car in Lot 44 behind North Residence Hall C, register and then return to your car for your luggage.

CHECK-OUT

You may check out at Registration anytime before 6 p.m. on the day of your departure. On Wednesday ONLY, you may turn in your key until 7 p.m. It is important to return your room key. The cost of losing it or keeping it as a souvenir will be \$60 per key. In addition, a lost or damaged residence hall access card is \$20.

PARKING AND TRANSPORTATION

PARKING ON CAMPUS

- All registered attendees will receive a parking pass that will allow them to park for free in Lot 44 behind North Residence Hall C upon registration.
- Metered parking is first come, first served.
- The MTA is not responsible for payment of any parking tickets issued to participants by town or campus police. PLEASE NOTE: UMass and the MTA cannot appeal parking tickets.
- Vehicles displaying a state-issued disabled placard or license plate may park in any marked Reserved Accessible Space, any regular, unreserved space, or any parking meter at no charge. All vehicles, regardless of disabled placards or plates, must pay when utilizing the Campus Center Parking Garage. *Note: regular, unreserved spaces exclude any lots/spaces marked as "24 hour restricted" and any spaces marked with a sign as reserved for UMass Police, residential staff, vendors, or other entities.*

THE MTA BUS

We have arranged for two UMass Buses. These buses will continuously loop and there will be signs marking the bus stops. The buses will pick up from all stops below approximately every 10-15 minutes.

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING

HOUSING DETAILS

The **MTA SUMMER CONFERENCE** will be housed at UMass Amherst. If choosing to stay on campus, participants will be assigned to rooms in air-conditioned residence halls.

- ROOMS & BATHROOMS: Each participant staying on campus stays in a suite-style dorm. Each suite is comprised of four single (and lockable) rooms that come with linens. (Bring an extra blanket if you get cold in air-conditioning.) Two rooms share one of the two bathrooms in the suite (No bathtubs). There is also a kitchen (no supplies are provided) with a common area. Please be considerate of your suitemates and neighbors when congregating in the common area.
- DAMAGE OR THEFT: UMass and MTA accept no responsibility for any damage to university property or theft experienced by individual conferees. All locks and other security devices are presumed to be in good operating condition and any evidence of malfunction should be reported to MTA registration staff immediately. The university asks that conferees assume collective responsibility for the buildings in which they live and contact the UMass Police Department immediately at 413-545-3111 should they find outsiders in their dormitory. Participants must lock their bedrooms whenever they are not in their rooms. Do not let anyone into the dorms who does not have his/her own key. Thank you for your cooperation.
- **HOUSEKEEPING:** Participants will maintain their own rooms, including taking out the trash. Trash receptacles are located on the bottom floor of each dorm.
- **KITCHENETTES:** A full-size refrigerator, sink, microwave and stove are included in every suite and are available for attendee use. Attendees are responsible for cleaning up any mess.
- LATE NIGHT ASSISTANCE: North Residence Hall C will have a UMass Housing staff person available 24/7, stationed at the desk in the lobby.
- LOST AND FOUND: Please return any "Found" items to Registration. If you lose an item, check with Registration Staff at Registration. They can tell you if anything has been turned in at Registration or connect with your Campus Staff at the Campus Center.
- ROOM KEYS AND DORM ACCESS: All individuals will be provided with private rooms inside the suites. Room keys will be distributed at check-in. Report inoperable locks/keys immediately to the MTA registration staff. You will use your swipe card to access the exterior doors to North Residence Hall as well as the suite. To enter your dorm room, please use the key provided. If you are unable to enter, please call the Summer Conference Housing hotline at 413-545-3400. As a reminder, all keys and cards must be returned to the Summer Conference Housing staff in the registration tent at check-out. Attendees will be charged \$60.00 for each unreturned/damaged room key and \$20.00 for each unreturned/damaged access card. Returns after guests leave campus will not be accepted.
- PET POLICY: Sorry, no pets are allowed.
- **SERVICE ANIMALS:** If you are bringing a service animal, please email *jparlon@massteacher.org* and *registration@umass.edu* so that we can make the proper arrangements ahead of time.
- WASHERS AND DRYERS: Washers, dryers and vending machines are located on the ground floor of each North Residence Hall building. There is a charge to use the washer and dryer. No detergent or dryer sheets are provided.

WIRELESS INTERNET

Wireless internet is available in all campus dorms and in classrooms. Instructions on how to access the internet are below. When you check in, we'll give you the username and password to use.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR CONNECTING TO WIRELESS INTERNET

- 1. In the WiFi settings on your phone/computer/tablet select the "UMASS" network
- 2. Open up a web browser (IT suggests using Safari or Firefox)
- 3. Manually type in the address bar: http://www.umass.edu
- 4. Either a page telling you that this site is unsecure will present itself or the UMass wireless login page will appear
- 5. If it is a page telling you that the website is unsecure, click "more details" or "advanced" at the bottom and click on the link to visit the page anyway
- 6. You should then land on the "Wireless at UMass Amherst" webpage as long as you entered: http://www.umass.edu
- 7. Enter the credentials given to you during Registration
- 8. The UMass home page should load and from this point you can type in any search query/website name you wish to visit

IT recommends that you save the guest ID and password in your browser to shorten the process for future logins.

NOTE: If you close the web browser, shut the laptop, or change your location you will need to initiate the login session from the beginning.

In the event UHS is closed, there is also AEIOU Urgent Care located at 170 University Drive, a short drive from campus. The facility is open 8 a.m.–8 p.m. Monday-Friday and 9 a.m.–3 p.m. Saturday and Sunday.

The closest 24-hour emergency room is at Cooley Dickinson Hospital in Northampton, MA. It is approximately a 15-minute drive from campus during low traffic hours, or up to 45 minutes away during rush hours. The address is 30 Locust Street, and the facility can be reached at 413-582-2000.

PRINTING OPTIONS

There will not be an MTA Print Shop onsite. The W.E.B DuBois Library has multiple copiers. Copies at the library are \$0.10 for black & white, \$0.50 for color. There is a Staples store located 2.5 miles from the UMass campus at 125 Westgate Center Drive, Hadley, MA. Staples will be your best option for large numbers of copies.





KNOW A KID WHO NEEDS A HELPING HAND?

Mass Child offers \$1,000 or more to MTA locals to help preK-12 students



WHO WE ARE & WHAT WE DO

The Massachusetts Child is a charitable corporation founded by the MTA in 1996. The Mass Child program reimburses MTA's preK-12 local associations for expenses related to items that directly benefit students in need, making it possible for them to succeed. The Mass Child Board of Directors reviews requests on a case-by-case basis to confirm that they meet the guidelines. Locals with 500 or fewer members may receive up to \$1,000 per school year. Locals with more than 500 members are eligible to receive reimbursements equal to \$2 per member. Mass Child is funded entirely through donations, and contributions of any amount are greatly appreciated.

WHAT WE REIMBURSE

Starting with the 2016-17 school year, the Mass Child has returned to its roots: assisting locals to make sure that students in need have appropriate clothing and school supplies that are not typically provided by schools. The Mass Child Board of Directors voted to end reimbursements for field trips, electronics (such as calculators and computer hardware and software) and extracurricular items in general. The decision was not made lightly, but we believe it ensures that as many children as possible are helped, especially because many more locals are now applying for Mass Child grants.

Mass Child will continue to be a resource for MTA members who want to make sure their students have warm clothing for the winter months, appropriate footwear, bags or backpacks, and materials not routinely supplied by schools, such as notebooks and binders.

In 2018, the Mass Child launched a literacy grant program to provide summer reading books to students in need. Check the Mass Child Facebook page and other MTA social media for information about participating in upcoming reading programs.

Purchases MUST be for specific children, and Mass Child cannot reimburse a local making bulk purchases. If you have any questions, please contact Mass Child President Jackie Lawrence at *JLawrence@somervilleteachers.com* or MTA staff consultant Scott McLennan at *smclennan@massteacher.org*

HOW TO PARTICIPATE

- GO SHOPPING Using funds from your local, buy the qualifying items for students with financial need.
- **SUBMIT A REIMBURSEMENT FORM AND RECEIPTS** The reimbursement form, available at *massteacher.org/masschild*, must be signed by the local association president. Receipts must clearly show which items the local wants reimbursed.
- **REIMBURSEMENT CHECKS** Checks will be made out to the local association. Checks are sent to locals after requests are reviewed at Mass Child board meetings.

FIRE/BUILDING EVACUATION

If you discover smoke or a fire, do the following:

Close the door to the fire area. This limits the

spread of fire and smoke and gives you more

Activate the nearest fire alarm and alert others

Evacuate building using your nearest exit (or alternate exit, if blocked); DO NOT use elevators.

Call 911 to report the fire (say "UMass Amherst"

SHELTER-IN-PLACE

When instructed to Shelter-in-Place, do the following:

- Go inside. Stay away from windows, close and lock the door, if possible.
- **DO NOT** exit the area until the emergency has passed or you are instructed to do so by emergency response personnel.



SUSPICIOUS PERSON OR PACKAGE

- DO NOT physically confront a suspicious person or handle a suspicious package.
- DO NOT let anyone into locked buildings/offices.
- DO NOT block a person's access to an exit.
- Contact UMass Police and provide as much information as possible about the situation.
- **Leave** the area or await further instruction from **UMass Police.**
- Barricade/Secure your area if you are unable to safely evacuate the area.



MEDICAL EMERGENCY

- **Contact** UMass Police. Provide information about the injury and the location of the victim(s).
- Remain with the victim until emergency response personnel arrive, if safe to do so.
- Provide medical assistance only if trained and necessary.
- If a victim is unconscious and not breathing, start CPR if trained, locate an AED, turn it on, and follow the instructions provided by the unit.



SEVERE WEATHER & TORNADOS

- Monitor television, radio, weather internet sites, or weather radio for information about approaching storms.
- If severe weather is expected to impact our area, seek shelter in a hardened structure, away from windows and follow Shelter-in-Place procedures (above).
- Stay away from large objects that may fall during a storm; e.g., bookcases and shelves.
- If unable to find shelter when a storm hits, lie down flat and cover your head with your hands.
